Security Advice for New RAF Air Cadets and Staff

Dear Parent/Guardian/Staff Member,

The purpose of this letter is to provide security advice for new RAF Air Cadets and Staff. Service security staffs and civilian police forces constantly monitor the security situation across the United Kingdom and provide national and local advice as required.

RAF Air Cadets taking part in official activities and events are covered by the security arrangements for that event in the same way that other Defence Personnel are. Whilst I must emphasise that there has been no direct threat to cadets reported, the main risk to cadets is being mistaken for Regular airmen or soldiers when travelling to and from cadet activity wearing uniform. It is this risk that, with your assistance, I would like to mitigate.

If you are a parent or guardian of an under 18 years of age cadet the decision whether the cadet travels to and from cadet activity wearing uniform is ultimately yours. If you are a cadet over 18 years of age then the decision is your own. However, based on the latest security advice, HQ RAF Air Cadets recommends that all RAF air cadets cover up their uniform whilst travelling to and from cadet activity. When wearing normal RAF air cadets' blue uniform this should not be difficult as removing beret from view and covering torso with a coat or other suitable outer garment should suffice. If travelling in military combat clothing (MTP or CS95), then your Squadron Commanding Officer or the activity organiser should consider providing changing facilities at the event to allow cadets to travel in civilian clothing, carrying uniform out of sight.

This general advice in this letter covers the whole of the United Kingdom with the exception of Northern Ireland which has separate arrangements.

I have been in contact with local security staffs and offer the following additional advice. When travelling to/ from or when at cadet activity, personnel should remain vigilant and immediately report any suspicious incident or behaviour to the Police on 101 or 999. I thank you for your support. If you have any questions, please address them in the first instance to your cadet's Squadron Commanding Officer at the contact details below.

Flying & Gliding	As an RAF Air Cadet, your child may have the opportunity of passenger or instructional flights in British military registered aircraft. All military aviation activity is conducted under MAA regulation (see https://www.gov.uk/government/organisations/military-aviation-authority). Whilst the activity is not directly delivered by the RAF Air Cadets, should such opportunities present themselves, your child will only be permitted in the aircraft if your consent has been given. Irrespective of aircraft type, your child will have been thoroughly briefed and appropriately supplied with safety equipment before flight. Medical fitness of cadets is important for the safety of the aircraft and crew. Cadets may be required to undertake further medical scrutiny before being allowed to fly in certain military aircraft types. If, because of further medical scrutiny, Cadets are found to be medically unsuitable, they will be prevented from undertaking flights. Your child may have the opportunity to participate in events that we have identified as higher risk. You will be asked to provide your express consent to your child's participation in these events on an individual basis and without explicit consent, your child will not be permitted to take part. Examples of higher risk events and activities might include (but not limited to): - Adventure training events including Duke of Edinburgh Award expeditions. - Fieldcraft training and more advanced field-based leadership courses. - Large public military events where cadets will be taking part in larger ceremonial parades occasionally involving marching on the public highway. - Longer duration events which may involve overnight stays. - Any other higher risk events identified and sanctioned by the RAF Air Cadets senior leadership. Details of what these events and activities will involve will be communicated through Cadet Portal at https://cadets.bader.mod.uk which all cadets have access to. Your child will be issued with appropriate consent forms and health declarations (which are available through Cadet Portal or unit Cadet Forces Adult Volunteers) for each higher risk event they participate in. The RAF Air Cadets is a data processor under the Data Protection Act (2018) and UK GDPR for the purposes of these virtual/web-based sessions.

Web-based/virtual sessions are strictly controlled, and we have robust policies in place to plan, organise and deliver these sessions to the cadets over the internet. Such sessions will always have a minimum of two Cadet Forces Adult Volunteers present and all sessions may be recorded. The recordings are held on the Cadet Forces infrastructure for safeguarding purposes and only the local unit and MOD Permanent Staff have access to the recordings.

Should parents/guardians not give consent for their child to take part in such sessions, cadets will not be permitted to take part.

I understand that I have the right as, as the adult with parental responsibility, to access data relating to my child, to be informed about the existence and extend of data processing, to rectify incorrect personal data and to oppose further processing on serious and legitimate grounds. The personal details contained in this Consent Certificate will be transferred to my child's central record held on the Cadet Forces MIS.

Consent for web-based/virtual training delivery and meetings may be withdrawn at any time by speaking to the local unit commander who will update the Cadet Forces MIS central record for the child in question. In that case, all processing operations that were based on your consent and took place before the withdrawal of consent remain valid.

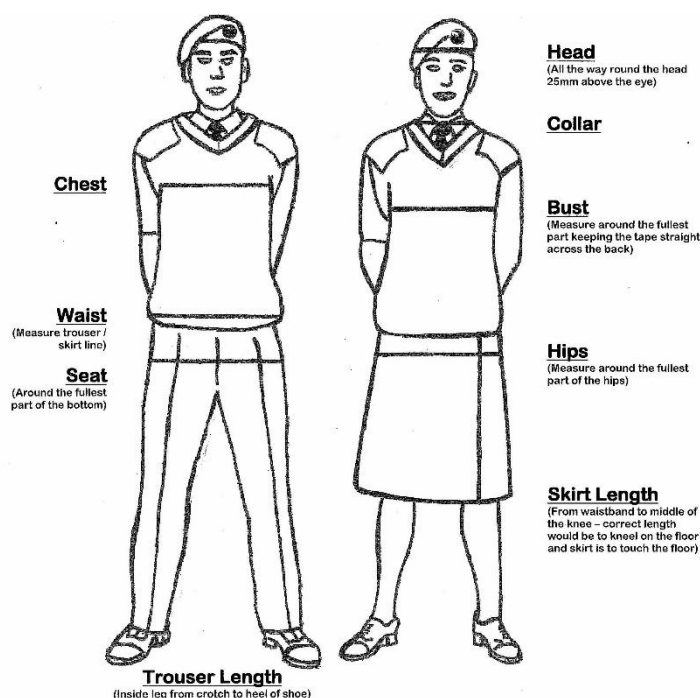

WEARING OF No 3 Dress – DPM and MTP – S & E Mids Wing Policy – Annex 3

1. Variations in CS95/MTP dress will be subject to exercise/training requirements, location and climate; the necessary mode will be decided upon through the relevant **OC Wg / Wg Ex O / Sqn Ldr CCF HQAC**. **CS95/MTP is never to be worn mixed together or in a combination with any other uniform modes.**
2. **IT IS NOT ACO POLICY TO ISSUE MTP TO STAFF AND CADETS.** The Squadrons will attempt to issue Combat Soldier 95/ MTP uniform where possible.
3. When clothing is purchased it should be of the MTP dress. Embroidered name badges are not worn on MTP. All uniform is to be suitably clean and ironed as befits the RAF, ATC and the South and East Midlands Wing.
4. It is emphasised, that the ATC/RAF remains predominately a blue uniformed organisation and CS95/ MTP should not be worn by personnel during normal ATC duties unless authorised for adventure training/ field craft exercises. CS95/ MTP are never to be worn in combination with 'blue' uniform modes.
